


### Introduction to Residential Schools (suitable for Kindergarten and up)



# When We Were Alone By David Robertson

A Grandmother answering her granddaughter's questions about why she does certain things, e.g. wearing colourful clothes, keeping her hair long and speaking Cree, by explaining that they weren't allowed to do those things in residential school.



# Shi-shi-etko by Nicola I. Campbell:

Shi-shi-etko spends the days leading up to her leaving for residential school doing special things with her family members.





# Grandparents explaining to their grandchildren how residential school affected their childhood (suitable for Kindergarten and up)




# **Stolen Words by Melanie Florence:**

### On the Trapline by David A. Robertson


A grandfather tells his grandson about his life on the trapline before he went to Residential School. "School" is briefly mentioned, but the story is more about what life was like with his family.
